





We are looking for interested individuals to become part of an exciting project as a **Woodland Ambassador** with the **Southern New England Heritage Forest (SNEHF) Partnership.** SNEHF is a 3-state working group of public and private partners combining efforts to ensure the future of our woods.

Love your woods? Learn how others are shaping the future of their woods.
"We moved here years ago when we needed to get out of the city. I fell in love with my land and wanted to learn more about the woods," said from "We've enjoyed the experience of building our trails and expanding the number of birds that visit our woods."
The actions we take or don't take affect the future of the woods around us. Knowing what you want is the first thing to clarify. Is privacy key? If so, then leaving a buffer of evergreen trees and giving them room to grow is a critical consideration. Do you want more birds, like warblers nesting in the woods? If so, then creating small openings in the tree canopy will allow new seedlings to start and increase the number of insects to provide more food for warblers during the summertime.
Decisions about what to do or not do can be complex. Come see what the family chose to do with their woods will share their reasons for completing a timber sale and what they think of the changes (include some of this information in the real release). Meet at at 10 am for a walk through their woods. We'll see and feel the results of letting more sunlight reach the soil. Come with your questions.

## A Family's Legacy: Fifty Years Managed Woods

Please join Woodland Ambassador Allen Woodward and his family for a tour of their woods in Thompson. For more than 50 years the Woodward family has managed their 150 acres of woods with long-term forest health and wildlife habitat as their goals. Allen's father was the CT Tree Farmer of the Year in the 1970's and his lasting legacy can be seen in the care and thoughtful stewardship that the family continues to this day. During the tour Allen will explain the results of a recent timber sale improvement, issues with invasive species, and concerns with deer browse on saplings as well as other areas of interest on this beautiful property.
