CONNECTICUT LAND CONSERVATION COUNCIL OUR HISTORY

- 2006: Merger of the Land Trust Service Bureau, which was formed in 1980 to provide technical support to land trusts, and the Land Conservation Coalition for Connecticut, which was formed in 1987 to serve as the advocacy arm of the land conservation movement.
- 2010: Hired first Executive Director and entered into fiscal sponsorship agreement with CT Forest & Park Association.
- 2018: Established as an independent 501(c)3.

CT LAND CONSERVATION COUNCIL WE WEAR MANY HATS!

As Connecticut's umbrella organization for the land conservation community, CLCC focuses on:

- Building land trust capacity and sustainability,
- Leading a unified land conservation voice for public policies that support land conservation, and
- Engaging broad constituencies to foster a deep understanding and need for land conservation.




LAND CONSERVATION IN CT "OPEN SPACE" PRIMER

C.G.S 8-23 (b) The Green Plan

- ❖ 21% = 673,210 acres
- **❖** 10% = 320,576 acres
- ❖ 11% = 352,634 acres

THE STATUS*

- ❖ TOTAL = 507,956 acres (75.45%)
- ❖ DEEP = 259,665 acres
- ❖ Partners = 248,291 acres

WHAT'S NEEDED!



CT LAND TRUST COMMUNITY BY THE NUMBERS!

- CT: 137 +/- land trusts ~ 3rd most per state in country
- US: ~ 1,700
- Protected ~ 200,000 acres (absolutely an underestimate)
- 29 accredited land trusts ~ 3rd most in the country
- **1,300 + board members**
- 4,500 + volunteers
- 37,000 + members/financial supporters
- Approx. 64 full-time and 94 part-time staff





CLCC 2020 STATE POLICY & FUNDING AGENDA

Incentivize Land Conservation, Stewardship, and Climate Resilience



ENABLE municipalities with an option to establish a limited buyer's conveyance fee program to fund the purchase, preservation, and stewardship of open space, forest, and farm lands; to implement climate resilience, mitigation or adaptation strategies; to match certain state environmental grant programs; and for other environmental projects.

(Compare: MA CPA Program)

CLCC 2020 STATE POLICY & FUNDING AGENDA

Incentivize Land Conservation, Stewardship, and Climate Resilience

ESTABLISH a public-private partnership to offer competitive matching grants to qualified Connecticut land trusts for programs that serve to advance land conservation through: (i) organizational capacity building; (ii) collaboration; (iii) stewardship and resource management; and (v) conservation transaction support.

(Model: NYSCPP)
